Civil law is one of the main branches of law, the core of private law, regulating property and personal non-property relations based on equality of subjects. Contributing to the establishment and development of market relations economy, strengthening property relations, civil law plays the most important role in the regulation of contractual relations. To a large extent, this process the latest achievements of the science of civil law also contribute. In this regard, arose the need to change the process of teaching a civil law course, bringing it in line with modern requirements.

Complete course civil law for students majoring in jurisprudence is designed to study within 2 years. This civil law short course lasts one semester and is designed to give students in the specialty "Economics" theoretical and practical knowledge in the field of civil law. It includes sections on basic concepts and categories of business law and business activities, certain types of obligations and contracts, property rights, legal entities and individuals, etc.

Special attention is paid to the differences in legal regulation of these relations in Russia and Armenia.

The purpose and objectives of the discipline

The purpose of the short course "Civil Law" is the assimilation of student's theoretical provisions of civil law with a special emphasis on provisions on regulation of entrepreneurial activity, subjects of civil law, representation, property rights, obligations and contract law, and practice of their application.
