The Macroeconomics Lecture Course provides an introduction to the basics macroeconomic theory and policy, and involves the study of key macroeconomic indicators such as national output, economic growth, unemployment, inflation, etc. During the lectures in detail the role of the state in the economy, especially monetary and credit and fiscal policy; and the role of money and the banking system in the economy.

After studying these topics, macroeconomic policy is analyzed in an open economy, in particular, the role of the balance of payments and methods of its regulation, as well as features of monetary policy.

Lectures involve an interactive communication format that allows students ask questions, bring up for discussion relevant within the discipline's topics questions, to be directly involved in the process of mastering new information. The course covers 10 topics in total, with 72 hours of classroom lessons per semester (accordingly, successful mastering of the discipline allows you to get 4 credits for every semester).
