

Discipline: Russian language and culture of speech

Labor intensity: 8 ECTS, 288 academic hours.

Final control form: test.

The general task of teaching Russian language to RAU students is complex, including practical (communicative) and educational goals.

The communicative goal is the leading one, it is carried out through the formation of students of the necessary language and speech skills.

Learning speech activity is considered as a single interconnected process, which draws attention to the development of both general and specific skills and skills.

One of the main tasks of the Program is mastering the Russian language of the specialty, reading special literature and using it in educational and professional activities.

The linguistic and regional aspect in teaching RAU students includes the following elements:

- systematic, consistent and purposeful inclusion of information on Russian studies in the process of teaching the Russian language;
- implementation of linguistic and regional studies at the level of all communicative spheres of education;
- use of linguistic and cultural potential, selected for educational purposes from a list of linguistic units with a national-cultural component of semantics, journalistic and artistic texts, works of art.

Since students are doing must have the following level of knowledge and skills:

Knowledge: the student must know the lexical and grammatical basic norms of Russian language; principles of Russian word formation; features of Russian accentology and orthoepy; stylistic norms of the Russian language.

Skill: the student must be able to communicate verbally and in writing forms in Russian for solving problems of interpersonal and intercultural interactions; solve standard tasks of professional activity based on information and bibliographic culture with the use of information and communication technologies; be able to locally research based on existing techniques in a specific narrow area; be able to prepare annotations, write abstracts and bibliography by subject.

Proficiency: the student must be fluent in Russian in its literary form, basic methods and techniques of various types of oral and written communication in Russian; possess basic creation skills based on standard techniques and current standards for various types of texts; possess basic skills of road work and processing (for example, proofreading, editing, commenting, summarizing, information and vocabulary description) of various types of texts; own the norms of Russian literary and colloquial speech.
